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## 3. Composition / Information on Ingredients

**Chemical Nature:** Highly refined mineral oils and proprietary performance additives.  
The highly refined mineral oil contains <3% (w/w) DMSO-extract, according to IP346

## 4. First Aid Measures

**Eye contact:** Flush eye with copious quantities of water.  
If persistent irritation occurs, obtain medical attention.

**Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed:** Oil acne/folliculitis signs and symptoms may include formation of black pustules and spots on the skin of exposed areas.  
Swallowing may result in nausea, vomiting and/or diarrhoea.

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## 5. Fire Fighting Measures

**Suitable extinguishing equipment:**

Foam, water spray or fog. Dry chemical powder, carbon dioxide, sand or earth may be used for small fires only.

**Unsuitable extinguishing equipment:**

**Do not use water in a jet.**

**Specific hazards during firefighting:**

Combustible liquid. In a fire, or if heated, a pressure increase will occur and the container may burst with the risk of a subsequent explosion.  
May produce toxic fumes if burning including possibly carbon monoxide, airborne solid and liquid particulates and gases and unidentified organic and inorganic compounds.

**Special protective equipment and precautions for firefighters:**

Proper protective equipment including chemical resistant gloves are to be worn; chemical resistant suit is indicated if large contact with spilled product is expected. Positive pressure Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus and full turn out gear should be worn.

## 6. Accidental Release Measures

**Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures:**  
**Environmental precautions:**

Avoid contact with skin and eyes, use appropriate personal protective equipment. Evacuate surrounding areas if necessary. Remove all ignition sources.  
Stop leak if without risk. Use appropriate containment to avoid environmental contamination. Prevent from spreading or entering drains, ditches or rivers by using sand, earth or other appropriate barriers.  
Local authorities should be advised if significant spillages cannot be contained.

**Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up:**

Slippery when spilt. Avoid accidents, clean up immediately.  
Reclaim liquid directly or in an absorbent.  
Soak up residue with an absorbent such as clay, sand or other suitable material and dispose of properly.

## 7. Handling and Storage

**Precautions for safe handling:**

Use in a well ventilated area.  
Wear appropriate protective equipment (See Section 8) and clothing to avoid inhalation of fumes or mist and contact with skin and eyes.  
Containers not in use should be closed.  
Do not smoke.  
Always wash hands after handling and prior to eating, drinking, smoking or using the toilet.

**Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities:**

Classified as a Class C2 (COMBUSTIBLE LIQUID) for the purposes of storage and handling.  
Store in a cool, well ventilated area away from heat and other sources of ignition, oxidising agents, foodstuffs, and out of direct sunlight.  
Keep containers securely sealed and protect against damage.



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## 8. Exposure Control / Personal Protection

<b>National Exposure Standards:</b>	No exposure standard has been established, however, the TWA National Occupational Health and Safety Commission (NOHSC) exposure standard for oil mist is 5 mg/m <sup>3</sup> . As with all chemicals, exposure should be kept to the lowest possible level.
<b>Biological limit values:</b>	Not available
<b>Engineering Controls:</b>	<b>Ventilation</b> - Use in well ventilated areas. Where ventilation is inadequate, a local exhaust ventilation system is required.
<b>Personal Protective Equipment Respiratory Protection:</b>	Normally not required, however if mists or vapours are generated in a poorly ventilated area an approved respirator with a replaceable vapour/mist filter is recommended.
<b>Eye Protection:</b>	Safety glasses with side shields, goggles or full face mask as appropriate. Individual circumstances will dictate the final choice of protection.
<b>Skin / Body Protection:</b>	Always wear long sleeves and long trousers or coveralls, and enclosed footwear or safety boots when handling this product. It is recommended that chemical resistant gloves (e.g. PVC) be worn when handling this product.
